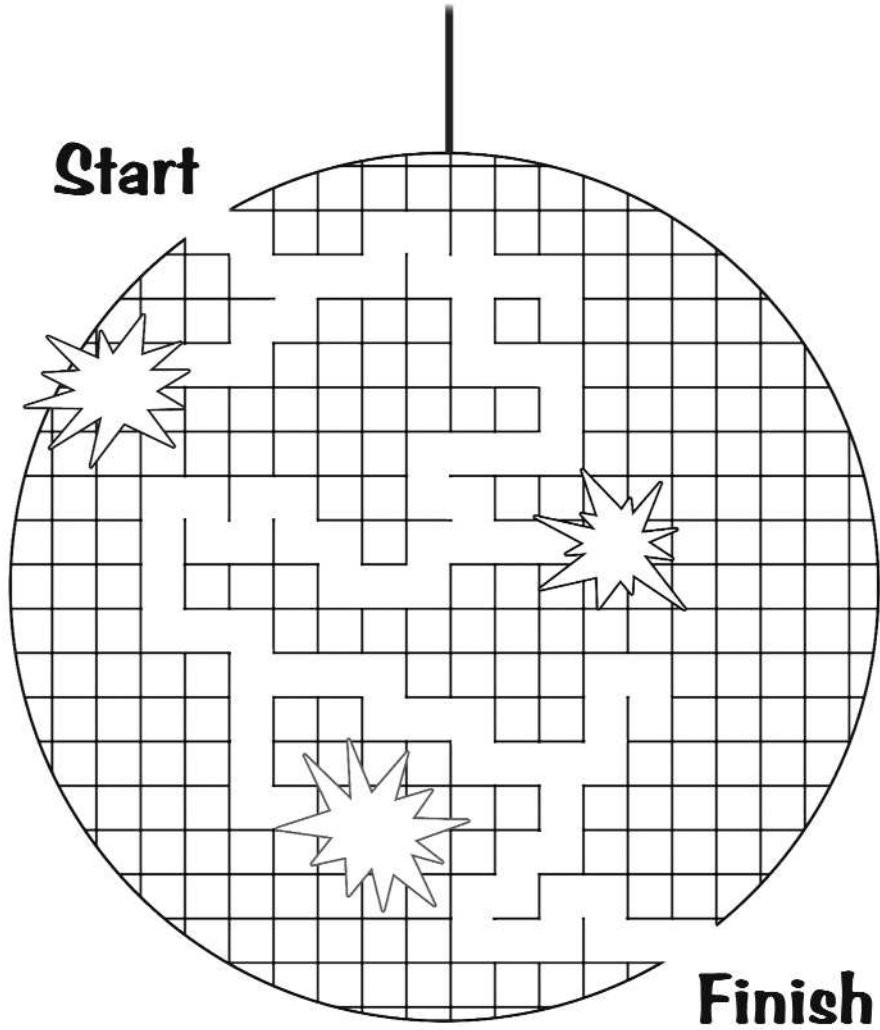
The Magic 8 Ball was invented by Abe Bookman of the Alabe Crafts Company in Cincinatti, Ohio in 1946.
